Responsibilities:

The Social Worker MSW carries out duties as a member of a multi-disciplinary team within various programs at Children's Centre Thunder Bay. Responsibilities include implementation of the Service Delivery Management System which includes case management, assessment, treatment, discharge planning and consultation and documentation. The Social Worker (MSW) will provide clinical leadership and primary case management for the more complex and high need, high risk adolescents and families in collaboration with other members of the multi-disciplinary team. The Social Worker (MSW) will play a leadership role in agency committee work, the development and implementation of new programs and services, staff training, research and evaluation, student placement and clinical consultation to other staff and community agencies. The Social Worker is required to work with diverse populations and work towards the inclusion of minority groups within the agencies services.

Qualifications:

The position requires a Master of Social Work degree from a recognized and accredited university and a minimum three years' experience in a related field. Registration with the Ontario College of Certified Social Workers is required. Knowledge of theories applicable to the children's and youth mental health sector as well as previous knowledge and experience in working with families and children and youth who require mental health intervention are essential requirements. The Social Worker requires above average skills in the assessment, consultation and treatment of adolescent, child and family mental health issues. The ability to effectively communicate within an organizational environment, work on a multi-disciplinary team, provide clinical training, use computer information and word processing systems, respond to crisis situations, participate in research and program evaluation, and write professional reports are essential skills for the job.
